

# Potsdam -A journey through Europe

Traveling through England, the Netherlands, Russia and Italy in one day? And by foot? Potsdam is rich in European influences. By strolling through the city you can easily cross Europe in a short amount of time. It is the longings of the rulers but also the friendships and political connections of the Hohenzollern dynasty that shaped the architecture of the city.

The tour through Europe starts in Potsdam's city centre at the St. Peter and Paul Church. which once was built for Belgian skilled workers. Within just a few steps you reach the Dutch Quarter. There, small boutiques and cosy cafés invite you to browse and linger. The museum Jan Bouman House provides insights into the exciting history of the quarter, which King Frederick William I had built for Dutch craftsmen. If you walk through the neo-Gothic Gate Nauener Tor out of town, within ten minutes you will find yourself in the setting of a Russian fairy tale.

The Colony Alexandrovka with its beautiful Alexander Nevsky Memorial Church was built by King Frederick William III to commemorate his friend Tsar Alexander I. The wooden houses built in a Russian style became a home to 12 Russian singers and their families. Then, a few metres of altitude have to be climbed in order to reach the destination of the tour. Yet the hike is worth it. From the towers of the palace Belvedere Pfingstberg you are rewarded with the most beautiful view of Potsdam. With the palace, King Frederick William IV realised his dream of Italy within Prussia. La dolce vita – that's the feeling which is felt here especially during the summer months!

# Attention! Border Area - Tracing East-West German history alongside the River Havel

In July 1945 the Potsdam Conference took place at Cecilienhof Country House which marks the end of the World War II. in Europe. With the agreement between the three victorious powers, the world order shaped after 1945 and was divided into two opposing sides. This eventually led to the construction of the Berlin Wall, running exactly through today's UNESCO World Heritage Site. The so-called "Iron Curtain" fell 44 years later.

On November 9, 1989, thousands of people were either watching or participating in the fall of the Berlin Wall. They went across Glienicker Bridge towards the wall where West and East Berlin celebrated the end of the German division as well as the subsequent German unity one year later.

The tour gives an insight into this eventful time and follows the traces of the former borderlines. Glienicke Bridge can be considered as the starting point. It became famous due to the exchange of spies between the Soviet Union and the USA in the midst of the Cold War. The former border strip is still visible in the middle of the bridge, as are the different coats of paint that demonstrate the former division. Going via road Schwanenallee you pass by the Quapphorn with its rebuilt hermitage and the Meierei leading up to the former GDR border tower at the Bertini-Enge. Between 1965 and 1990 there was a central border crossing point for shipping traffic between the

GDR and West Berlin.

Today only a few remains of the barriers bear evidence to the almost irreconcilable border security system. Eight information boards along the tour remind you of this time and provide impressive background information.



# Art by the River -Walk along River Havel

Just like the River Havel river, Potsdam's diverse art scene runs like a ribbon through the city. It is impossible to imagine Potsdam without the arts. The Museum Barberini and the Potsdam Museum as well as in Schiffbauergasse the Kunstraum Potsdam and the Museum FLUXUS+ are amongst the most important places to enjoy art. Yet a stroll through the small galleries will also warm the hearts of art lovers.

The "Walk of Modern Art" shapes the museum scene into an open-air gallery, making art along the river accessible to all. At the open-air gallery along the banks of the River Havel, artists deal with the theme of the path: water and landscape in their immediate surroundings. Nine very different artistic objects can be discovered.

The route leads from the Alter Markt Square with the Museum Barberini and the Potsdam Museum along the banks of the Alte Fahrt, past the Freundschaft Island to the quarter of Schiffbauergasse.

Here, at the cultural hub of the city, you can see more sculptures such as the imposing "Krieger" by Armando and also visit the Kunstraum Potsdam and the Museum FLUXUS+. If your feet are tired, but you're hungry for more, take the tram line "Kulturtramlinie 93" from the Schiffbauergasse quarter to Glienicke Bridge. Directly on the shore of Lake Jungfernsee is the Villa Schöningen, which exhibits national and international art in- and outdoors. Additionally, the museum's café provides a small, well-deserved art break.

For your return, we recommend taking the water taxi: departing at the bottom of the Glienicke Bridge its route takes you back downtown to Potsdam's harbour.

# Film tour – Exploring Film Locations by Foot

More than 100 years of exciting film history can be discovered in Potsdam. To this day, the city offers the best production conditions with Studio Babelsberg. Since 2019, Potsdam is the first UNESCO Creative City of Film in Germany. In the city centre and gardens of the palaces, you will find numerous famous filming locations to be discovered along the way.

From the Alter Markt Square to the New Palace in Sanssouci Park, the tour follows on the footsteps of cinema films and series – made by Babelsberg. The Filmmuseum, part of the Babelsberg KONRAD WOLF Film University, turns the creation of films to life, from the actual script to the finished film. Perfect for immersing yourself in film history.

The surroundings of the museum play an important role in the film world: New Pleasure Ground, Alter Markt Square and Neuer Markt Square are present in the former Fridericus Rex films of the 1920s. Otto Gebühr played the great Prussian king so realistically that the people of Potsdam greeted him on the street as King Frederick II. The St. Nicholas' Church can be seen in the film "The Wave" and if you walk further towards the city centre you will reach the Dutch Quarter – a popular location in the series "SOKO Potsdam", "Jerks" or even "Homeland". Children may also recognise the neighbourhood from "Hexe Lili". A small detour to the city hall on Friedrich-Ebert-Strasse is a must for all crime fans. The building appears in "Polizeiruf 110" and "Pfarrer Braun," among others.



The tour continues via the streets of Hegelallee and Brandenburger Straße to Sanssouci Park. This has always been a popular setting. Konrad Wolf filmed "Ich war 19" in the New Chambers in early 1968, and Hollywood moved the Orangery Palace to Istanbul for "Around the World in 80 Days."

Anyone with tired feet after this cinematic walk can take the bus 695 from the New Palace – where, among other things, "The Emperor's New Clothes" was filmed - back to the city centre or to the main station.

# Alter Fritz – Cycling around the UNESCO World Heritage

On the trail of Frederick II, popularly known as Alter Fritz (Old Fritz), you can also delve into the magic of Potsdam's palaces and gardens. The rich UNESCO World Heritage Site still maintains the magnificence of past epochs. It narrates the stories of the former rulers' aspirations and still takes the visitors' breaths away with its wonderful diversity and majesty.

The cycling tour begins at the Potsdam's historical centre i.e. the Alter Markt Square. Alter Fritz had it once redesigned based on the architecture of an Italian square.



Overlooking Breite Straße, you pass by the Steam Engine Building, which resembles a mosque, in the direction of Park Sanssouci. Watching Charlottenhof Palace you can feel the hints of Italy. You can already inspect the stunning cupola of the New Palace in the distance. Frederick II used the palace as a stately guest house and intentionally staged it, while Sanssouci Palace remained his very private summer residence. As per Frederick II's own wish, his grave is located on the upper terrace of the palace right next to his beloved dogs. To this day his grave is regularly decorated with potatoes by visitors. This is done in memory of him as he campaigned for the cultivation of potatoes and gave a desired large-scale cultivation of potatoes a chance.

The cycling tour continues from the palace along the historic Voltaireweg passing by the Russian Colony Alexandrovka, while riding towards the New Garden. Frederick's successor, Frederick William II, set up his own summer residence at Marble House on the grounds of the New Garden and on the shores of lake Heiliger See. The gardener Johann August Eyserbeck was responsible for the design of the New Garden.



From here the path brings you back to the city centre, passing by the Cecilienhof Country House which is famous for hosting the Potsdam Conference in 1945. Once in the city centre, the Dutch Quarter with its cosy atmosphere ensures a relaxing stop to your tour before returning to Potsdam Main Station.



# Surrounding the Lake Templiner See - A mystery Cycling Tour

The cycling tour surrounding the Lake Templiner See proves that culture and nature go hand in hand in Potsdam. Alter Markt Square is the compelling point for the mystery trip down to the Lake Templiner See. You can enjoy an astonishing view of the entire city with its sights from the dome of the St. Nicholas Church and many more. It is also particularly explicit here how closely the city is connected to the River Havel and its lakes.

Passing through the main train station, the journey leads along the shore of Lake Templiner See towards Caputh. Tiny bathing and swimming spots constantly invite you to stay longer. A detour to the Einstein House and Caputh House and Estate should not be missed. The scientist Albert Einstein spent heaps of time in this summer cottage and preferred this place of residence in the last years of his stay in Germany and before moving to the US.

Steam Engine Building (Mosque)

The Caputh House and Estate is the oldest preserved palace building in the cultural landscape of Potsdam because it dates back more than 350 years and therefore leads back to the Great Elector Frederick William.



You still have the opportunity to take a bit of a rest along the riverside before heading to Geltow by ferry. Here you can watch leisure captains, leisure swimmers and epicures. The bike path alongside the banks of the River Havel in Geltow leads back to the Potsdam city centre passing by the so-called Airship harbour – on the shore of Lake Templiner See.

As the name implies, airships by Count Zeppelin landed on the site from 1911 to 1917. Zeppelins were also built here. In the 1920s the city of Potsdam redesigned the area as water sports and snorkeling spots, using it today as an Olympic base is part of its tradition. Taking off from here, the airship harbour, the shore path ends up directly to the city centre. If you want, you can take the regional express train from Charlottenhof station to the main station.

# Canne Trip – From Lake Griebnitzsee to Glienicke Bridge and back



Lake Griebnitzsee is part of the picturesque Havel waterscape. Considering the nearby paddle rental station, Griebnitzsee S-Bahn station provides the perfect starting point for a tour through the park and palace landscapes of Potsdam – heading out on a canoe, kayak or stand up paddling board trip.

On the Southern shore of the lake you may paddle along the mansion colony Neubabelsberg. Architectural pearls follow each other just like on a precious chain. During the 19th century, anyone who owned a mansion on the Southern shore of Lake Griebnitzsee mostly tended to have rank and fame. The proximity to the film studios also made the mansion colony attractive for filmmakers.

Created by the famous Bauhaus architect Mies van der Rohe, the Villa Urbig is one of the best-known mansions on the lakeside,. It is also known as the Churchill mansion since the British Prime Minister resided here during the Potsdam Conference in 1945. Today the property belongs to SAP co-founder Hasso Plattner.












Villa at Lake Griebnitzsee

The sprawling area of the Babelsberg Park reaches as far as the mansion colony of Neubabelsberg. The first German Emperor William I spent his summer in the English neogothic style Babelsberg palace. In order to not distract visitors William I defined requirements to the people living in the vicinity of lake Griebnitzsee. They were not to build too pretentious houses on the street side. This is the reason why plenty of mansions only reveal their pure pulchritude by water. The final stop on this tour is Glienicker Bridge - the spot of exchanging spies between the Soviet Union and the US during the division of Germany and ultimately an important spot during the celebration of the German reunification in 1989.



The return tour directs along the Northern shore of the lake. This journey captivates thanks to its untouched nature and demonstrates elegance through confidentiality. It offers an ideal habitat for gray herons, cormorants or beavers.

# HIKING IN THE CITY OF POTSDAM


'All paths lead to Rome'. Nevertheless, from now on 'to Potsdam'?! Being likely to be a very popular destination, Potsdam reminds of this famous German saying. Two of the twelve European hiking paths intercross this city. The E10 extends from North to South and the E11 extends from West to East. Both ways lead straight through Brandenburg and reflect the diversity of the glacial region with its hilly and wooded sections, idyllic lakes, sandy paths and shadowy avenues. The long-distance hiking paths are well provided with road signs and are marked with a blue bar on a white background.

If you want to go even deeper into the Havel waterscape, you may keep the 66-lake hiking path in mind. It starts in Potsdam and goes through the region along streams, rivers, pools and ponds. You can plan your hiking tour for single destinations or for the entire 417 km.
